Dear Parents/Guardians of P1 Students,

On behalf of all staff, I wish you a Happy New Year and welcome to Red Swastika School once again! I look forward to a fruitful year as we journey together in partnership to develop your child/ward holistically.

2. PSLE 2017 Achievements

2017 was another milestone for the school's journey of academic excellence with the sustained results in the PSLE. This was only made possible from the hard work put in by the Primary 6 students, staff and parents. I am pleased to share the highlights of our results:

- 100% passes for all standard subjects
- 85.3% of the P6 cohort is eligible for Express Course in Secondary School.
- 38.1% of students with Quality Passes (A* - A) in all 4 subjects.
- Percentage of Quality Passes (A* - A) is above National Performance.

3. Curriculum Time in 2018

Please be reminded that Primary 1 students are to be in their respective classes for pledge-taking no later than 12.15pm. All students are encouraged to arrive in school at least 5 minutes before the reporting time to give themselves time to settle in and get ready for the day.

For the meal breaks from 5.10pm to 5.20pm, please prepare snack items for your child/ward to pack to school or to give your child/ward pocket money to purchase them before school and during recess. Please be reminded that there will not be any sharing of food among students as individuals may have different allergies.

Snack items for meal breaks should be in line with the healthy meal programme. The recommended snack items include bread, biscuits, muffins, muesli bar, dried cereal, fresh/dried fruits and plain water. Lessons can still carry on or toilet breaks will be given during the meal break. There will not be meal breaks during assessment period.

We like to reiterate that there will not be any facilitation of handing over of any student's work/item or passing of pocket money via the general office. Parents/Guardians are strongly urged to remind their children/wards to bring their learning materials, homework assignments and sufficient pocket money to school each day.

6. Smart Notification Acknowledgement Console (SNAC) Updates

We like to thank all P1 parents/guardians who have registered with SNAC. We have attained about 70.5% usage and we hope to achieve 100% registration from all parents/guardians by mid Term 1.

If you are still experiencing technical problems in uploading or/and registering SNAC, please email our vendor at snac.support@apptitude.sg for technical support or write to redswastika@moe.edu.sg and we will gladly assist you.

We will be sending school letters through SNAC and monitor the effectiveness and workflow efficiency in our information dissemination and communication with our parents/guardians.

7. Interim Point of Contact

You have indicated the preferred point of contact in the Verification Form during P1 Orientation at the end of last year 2017. Please let your child's/ward's Form Teacher know if there is/are any other change/s to be made to the given information.

If the preferred contact person has travel plans at any time of the year, please email your child/ward's Form Teacher/s to inform the school. The email should include:

- a) your child/ward's name and class;
- b) the period in which the contact person is away;
- c) an interim contact person whom you have entrusted supervision over your child/ward;
- d) his/her relationship with your child/ward; and
- e) his/her contact number.

This will enable the school to maintain communication for school matters or emergency cases pertaining to your child/ward.

8. Temperature-Taking

A temperature taking exercise is scheduled to be conducted on Thursday, 4 January 2018 and Friday, 5 January 2018. This exercise will serve to educate students on the need to take personal responsibility for their own health and practise social responsibility. All Primary 1 students will be given a new Oral Digital Thermometer.

9. Founder's Day

We will be celebrating our 67th Founder's Day on Friday, 12 January 2018. The theme for 2018 is *Founder's Fiesta*. All Primary 1 to Primary 6 students will report to school by 7.30 am and school dismissal will be at 10.15 am. Please refer to Annex A for more details.

10. World Red Swastika Society Spring Festival Luncheon for the Underprivileged Families

As an ongoing practice, we will be partnering the World Red Swastika Society in distributing red packets and hosting lunch for underprivileged families receiving public assistance. This year's Spring Festival Luncheon will be held on Saturday, 3 February 2018. The Society will be working with a few Senior Activity Centres on this event. Our students who are on the financial assistance scheme will also be invited. In addition, students from a few CCAs will also be staging a performance on that day.

Your child can play a part to spread a little kindness. We will be circulating some donation tins to appeal to students to help in the raising of funds for this event from Thursday, 1 February to Friday, 2 February 2018. We hope that you could encourage your child to donate generously. You may also wish to give your donation to your child's form teacher or write a cheque to 'The World Red Swastika Society'. On the reverse side of the cheque, please indicate 'World Red Swastika Society Charity Fund' and your child's name and class.

11. Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP)

HMSP is introduced by Health Promotion Board, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, to enhance the availability of healthier food and beverage choices in schools. Since 2016, the school canteen has been cutting down on fats, sugar and salt and serving healthy set meals from the four main food groups – brown rice and wholemeal bread, meat and others, vegetables and fruit. The healthy set meals are priced according to the different serving sizes, i.e., Extra Small - \$1.00, Small - \$1.30, Medium - \$1.60 and Large - \$2.00.

As eating a nutritionally balanced diet supports optimal growth and development for the children/wards, we hope you will continue to support the above programme and work hand in hand with us to encourage your children/wards to adopt healthy eating habits, both in school and at home.

12. Safety and Health Matters

As we start this year together, I like to take this opportunity to reiterate the importance of ensuring the safety of our students during school arrival and dismissal time. For students who walk or cycle to school, please be reminded to take extra precaution when on their way to school. For students who travel by other modes of transport such as by cars, the drop-off point is at the HDB car park **next to Gate 5**. There is to be **no drop off at Gate 3** at all times.

Under the Environmental Protection and Management (Vehicular Emissions) Regulations, it is an offence to leave the engine of a motor vehicle running when it is stationary for reasons other than traffic conditions. Errant motorists can be fined up to a maximum of \$5000. To achieve better air quality and safeguard public health, please remember to turn off your car engines while waiting for your children/wards.

We also seek your help to remind your child/ward of good hygiene practices. If your child/ward feels unwell, please bring him/her to seek medical help and he/she is to rest at home to fully recover.

13. No Birthday Celebrations

Please be reminded that the school will not facilitate any request for birthday celebrations in school in view of the feelings of all other students, their dietary needs and possible allergic reactions.

SAFETY OF SCHOOL CHILDREN ON OUR ROADS

Children are usually more vulnerable when it comes to using the road. They may not know what to do or look out for. Enhancing safety at school zones is therefore imperative and requires the joint effort of schools, parents, the community and authorities.

As parents, you have a pivotal role to play - by setting a good example and to educate your child on the importance of road safety.

This brochure contains information on how you can help enhance road safety at school zones. On the inside pages is a cartoon school bus, filled with road safety messages and intended to help your child learn about road safety in a fun and engaging manner. You can guide him/her along by inserting key words into the messages. After that, you can turn the bus into a 3D model simply by cutting along the edges of the school bus. Don't forget to get your child to personalise it by writing his/her name on the school bus!

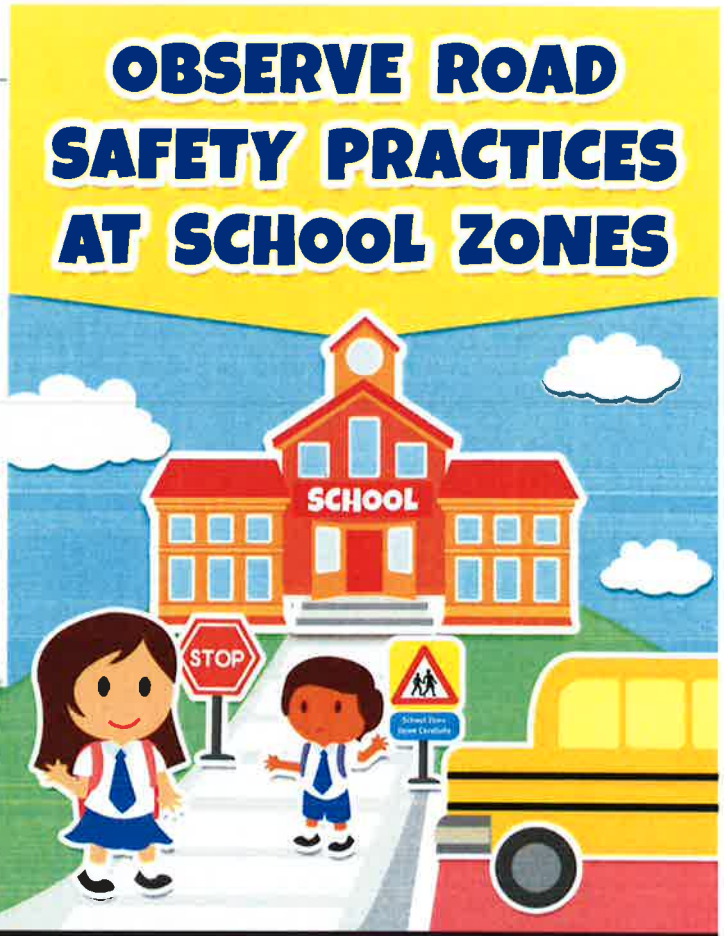
I hope both of you will enjoy this meaningful activity together!

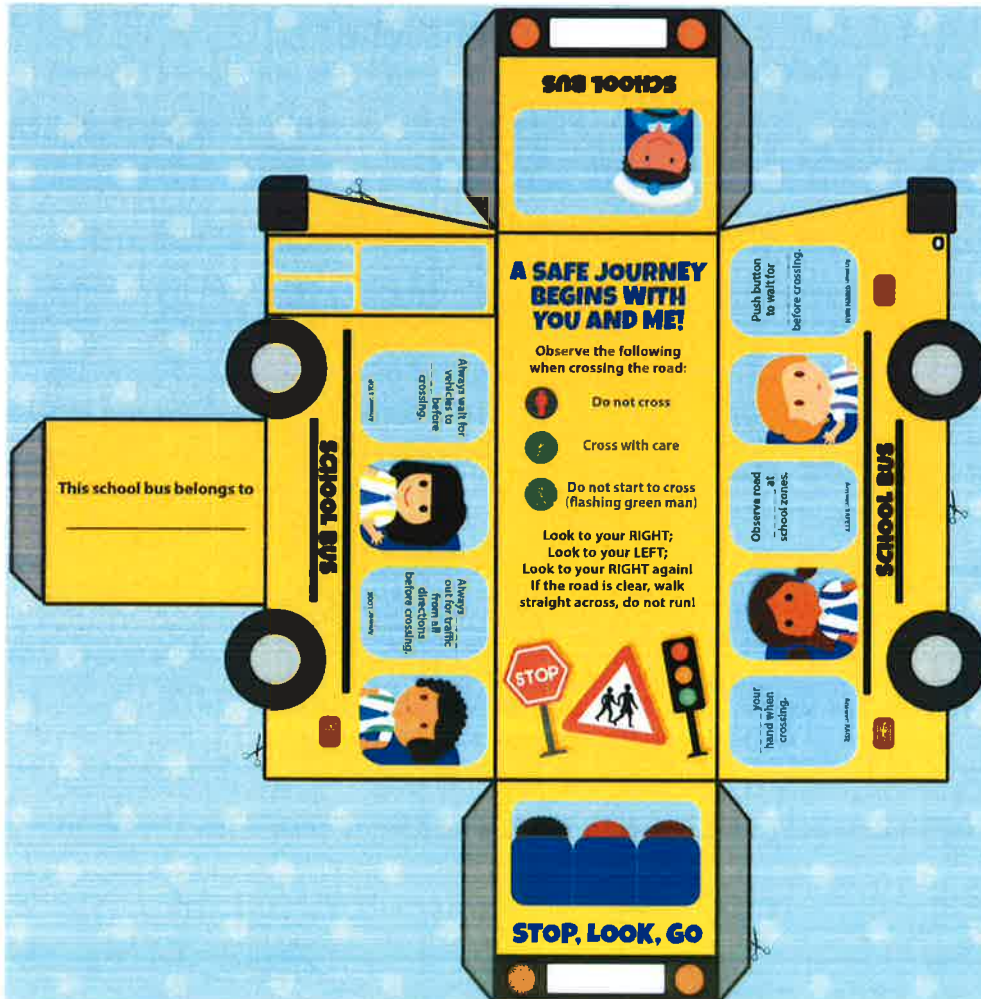

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TRAFFIC SAFETY MEASURES

Keeping children safe in school zones is top priority. Several traffic measures are implemented at school zones to remind motorists to slow down, drive carefully and to look out for children crossing the road.

- These include:
- ✓ School zone signs
 - ✓ Traffic calming measures such as road humps
 - ✓ Pedestrian crossings
 - ✓ Parking restriction lines
 - ✓ Railing along the road centre
 - ✓ "SCHOOL" road marking and red-textured road surfaces (especially for roads fronting primary schools)



TIPS FOR PARENTS

Parents and motorists have a responsibility to help ensure the safety of children.

- To reduce traffic congestion along school zones, consider the following alternatives when ferrying your child to/from school:
- ✓ Walk to school, take public transport or school bus.
 - ✓ Car/taxi pool - Share with those staying nearby or en route to your child's school.
 - ✓ If you still need to drive, please pick up or drop off your child at proper parking places (e.g. public car parks) so that your child's and other road users' safety will not be compromised.



GUIDING YOUR CHILD

- Set the right example for your child when crossing the road:
- ✓ Use designated crossings.
 - ✓ Teach your child to look out for potential safety hazards such as not to walk between parked vehicles or buses.
 - ✓ Do not rush. Look out for traffic in all directions as drivers do not always stop when they should.
 - ✓ Be attentive and avoid using gadgets such as MP3 players or mobile phones.
